### **Statement for Letters**

Trout Unlimited Canada (TUC), the voice for Canada’s water, is a national conservation charity that is science-based and volunteer-driven. #### **Option 1**

Trout Unlimited Canada (TUC), the voice for Canada’s water, is a science-based, national, charitable conservation organization. We were founded in 1972 in response to challenges to freshwater fisheries. Our focus on volunteer driven, science-based resource conservation and commitment to hands-on activities continue to grow. Our mission is “to conserve, protect and restore Canada's freshwater ecosystems and their coldwater resources for current and future generations”. Our programs have a watershed focus and are implemented directly by staff and through engagement of our local chapters, volunteers, and partners. Our programs and projects focus on assessment, monitoring and restoration work on freshwater systems, ensuring healthy water quality and quantity, healthy habitats and healthy freshwater fish communities.

#### **Option 2**

Trout Unlimited Canada (TUC), the voice for Canada’s water, is a national, charitable conservation organization. We are a volunteer-driven, science-based organization with over 10,000 supporters across Canada. TUC's Western Office is in Calgary, Alberta and the Eastern office is located in Guelph, Ontario. The full-time staff administers the day-to-day activities of the organization and provides professional and scientific support to its volunteer-driven chapters across the country. The mandate of the organization is “to conserve, protect and restore Canada’s freshwater ecosystems and their coldwater resources for current and future generations.” Our chapters and volunteers are action-oriented and are involved in conservation education, stream rehabilitation, habitat restoration and habitat protection across Canada.
